The Grant County Historical Society members and guests met for the Annual Meeting and Dinner at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 15, 2009, at the Sunnycrest United Methodist Church.

Information sheets that give the schedule of events for the May 30 event were distributed. The registration fee is \$65 and includes all five sessions with Megan Smolenyak, (well-known for her contributions to genealogy research), lunch, and evening banquet.
- The May 20 meeting will feature Patty Chapman, presenting a program on the History of Gas City.

The minutes of the 2008 Annual Meeting and the Treasurer's report were approved as presented.

The election of Board members was conducted. The three-year terms of Kay Dougherty, Ralph Kirkpatrick, Juanita Rapp, and Clyde Wilson on the Board of Directors ended in April 2009. All are willing to serve again. On motion of Nancy Scott, seconded by Mozelle Humbert, these four members were unanimously re-elected to the Board for 2009-2010. Nancy Scott finds it necessary to resign as a Board member, and she was presented with a certificate of appreciation for her service.

Sue thanked all our members who helped to make this past year successful. Regret was expressed that Society members Don Brown and Betty Ann Powers had passed away.

Ken Israel thanked everyone for the get-well card and expressions of concern regarding his recent injury. Stan Steiner updated the group on Asherwood.

Stan introduced Mel Hankla, presenter of our evening program. Mr. Hankla has been active in the "living history" of the frontier era since the early 1980s. He enacted the fascinating life of Simon Kenton (1755-1836), explorer, early Kentucky settler, and friend of Daniel Boone.

The program was excellent, and appreciation was expressed to Mr. Hankla.
