# **Minutes of Grant County Historical Society Meeting**

### Wednesday, July 19, 2023

## **Monthly Meeting- Marion Library**

The July 2023 Historical Society meeting was held at the Marion Library. President Travis convened at 6:20pm. There 22 members & guests present. All officers were present. Pledge of Allegiance was offered. The June Society meeting minutes were distributed. They were corrected to show the July meeting as being the 19<sup>th</sup>. After correction, the minutes were approved. The financial report was distributed with motion to pass. Club has total assets as of 7-19 of \$8,582.58.

Emily Morris showed a bottle opener from her father's store and a quilt from her great grandmother.

Dave Homer showed a toy metal airplane that he had played with as a child. It was probably first available in the 1930s in Dayton OH. He thought it was purchased locally in Hartford City or Marion.

Renee Bisell-Cole showed a women's wool/silk blend shawl from approximately 1817. It has been in the family for 8 generations, going back to Susanna Tup. She also showed an antique tractor part from her grandfather used as a paper weight.

Jackie Steiner showed a watch assembly from approximately 1812. The watch maker is stamped as P. Pryor in London England.

Bob Miller showed a book from his grandfather's library. The book is in German script, and is a history of Menno Simmons, founder of the Mennonite church.

President Travis adjourned the meeting at 8:25pm. Next meeting will be August 16<sup>th</sup> at the library.
