- o Tina is preparing a spread sheet for our participation in community events next year. May involve our booth, parades, etc. Participation in Fall Fest is still possible. There is a car/motorcycle show at the VA on 9-14.
- The IOOF cemetery has two mounds on the property that are in DNR review.
 Use of the mounds is unknown, but there do not appear to be human remains.
 Ownership of the cemetery is still in litigation.
- DAR will give a presentation for American Vietnam vets on September 6 at 10 am. Breakfast will be provided at Millers Merry Manor.
