 - Historical Markers met to do original documents research for the Martin Boots marker.
 - No other committee activity.
- Travis has done some upgrading on the website. In the future, this will fall under the Social Media Committee.
- The Secretary will present information on membership cards during the July meeting.
- During Show & Tell time, Renee showed a silver spoon originally from her 5th great grandmother in 1860. Photos are available on the web site.
- Problems with the IOOF cemetery in town were discussed. Several mausoleums have maintenance issues, and vandalism is an issue. The cemetery was mentioned for a possible fall lantern tour.
