Membership Meeting

Tina mentioned the Van Buran Popcorn festival coming up in a couple weeks. Gas City has a First Friday activity. There is a summer parade in Swayzee, and the Upland Labor Day parade. We will try to register for the Popcorn Festival.

President Sarah is also working on more engagement with other county historical societies. Most of the communities have their own smaller society. We would like to explore opportunities with all the groups doing some activity together.

The Friends of the Library grant is still pending. If we are awarded one, we would have to provide our own \$300 seed. Member IDs of a badge, shirt, etc. was discussed.

- Janice showed jewelry from mother & grandmother
- Bob showed a leather coin purse & silver dollars from his grandfather
